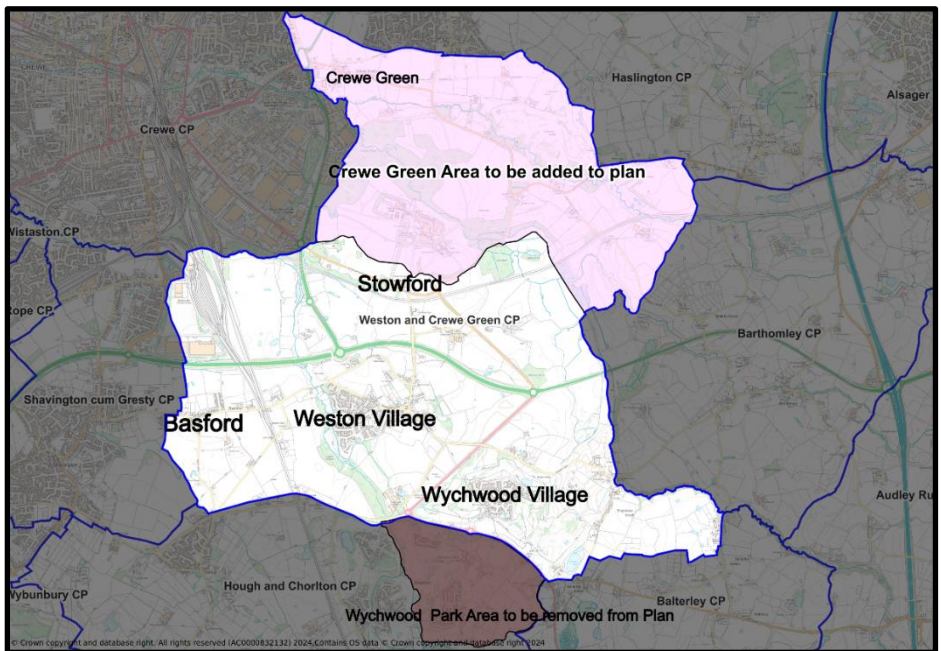
# Neighbourhood Plan

I reported earlier this year that the Weston & Basford Modified Plan had been formally approved in February 2024 and now forms part of the statutory development plan for Cheshire East Council alongside the Cheshire East Local Plan.

The Modified Neighbourhood Plan and all the associated documents including a new Design Guide produced by AECOM can be viewed via the Weston and Crewe Green Parish Council website.

Following the review of Parish Boundaries in April last year we are now in the process of incorporating Crewe Green into the Plan and remove the Wychwood Park area which is no longer in the parish (see map below).

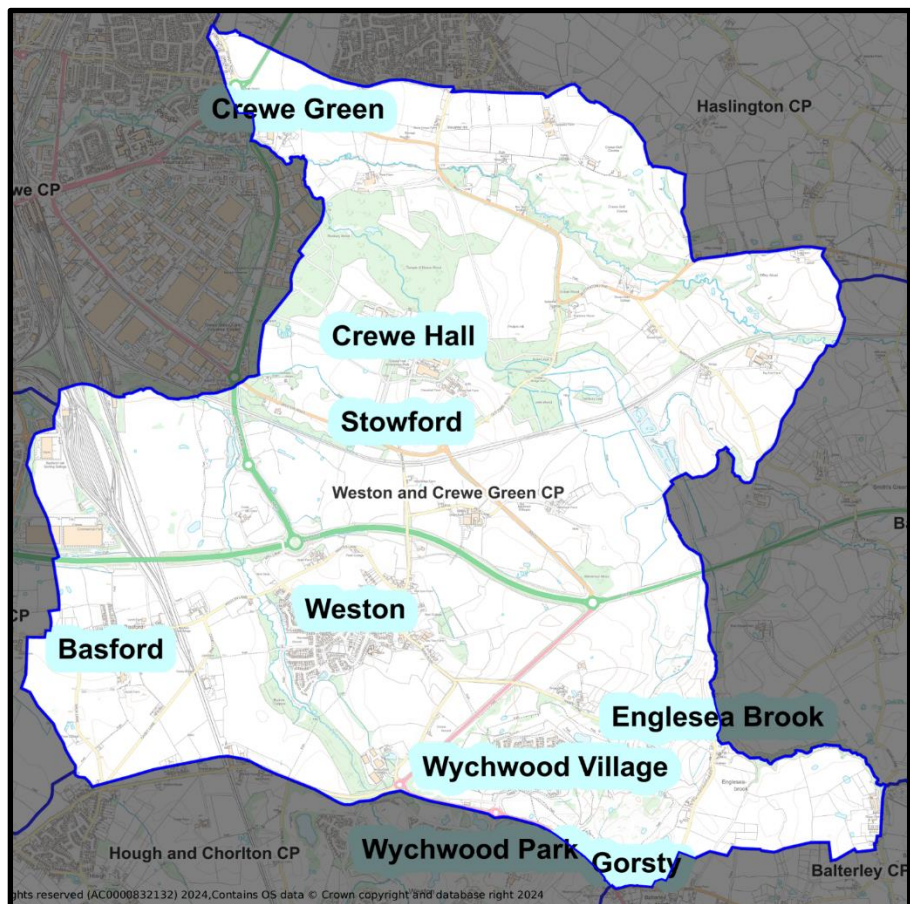


Map showing Parish Boundary and areas to be added and removed.

This will involve the preparation of a new plan with a change of name to the Weston and Crewe Green Neighbourhood Plan. The new plan will be valid until 2030 to coincide with the life of the existing Cheshire East Local Plan.

The existing Weston and Basford Neighbourhood Plan will be our starting point from which to build the new plan but as part of the process we want to consider whether the existing policies remain the most appropriate for the wider area or whether there are other themes that should be explored.

For those residents not familiar with a Neighbourhood Plan, it basically sets out the detailed Planning Policies which we as a community wish to see in our area. These policies will be read alongside and support those in the Cheshire East Local Plan.

The aims of the Neighbourhood Plan will be to protect the character of those individual settlements which make up our Parish alongside the quality of life of the residents who live within them. The policies give added weight to resisting unplanned and unwanted development and will help ensure that new proposals meet the highest standards.

To support the new Neighbourhood Plan Cheshire Wildlife Trust are currently updating their existing ecological work as well as looking in depth at the Crewe Green area.

In addition, AECOM are in the process of reviewing their Design Guidance for the whole of the new plan area.

**We welcome feedback on the new plan as it develops and will keep everyone informed of progress along with details in Community News, on the Parish Council notice boards as well as the Parish Council website.**

At the end of the process if it is considered by the Examiner, that there are significant changes to the plan, the legislation dictates that we must have a referendum. This will be arranged by Cheshire East.

## Consultation launched on household waste collections

Cheshire East residents are invited to have their say on plans for how weekly food waste collections could be introduced across the borough.

Simpler Recycling Scheme legislation, announced by the Government in October 2023, means that all local authorities must collect food waste from their residents on a weekly basis by no later than 1 April 2026.

This is a significant operational change affecting almost all residents in Cheshire East, and the financial impacts on Cheshire East Council will also be significant – estimated to be around £1.5m per year.

The council has not been told how much funding it will receive from Government to compensate it for introducing these changes, and there is a significant risk that the funding will not cover the costs in full.

To reduce this financial burden, the council is now consulting on a preferred option for rolling out weekly food waste collections, which would include changing black bin collections to once every three weeks.

If implemented, this change would be delivered at the same time as the weekly food waste collections begin.

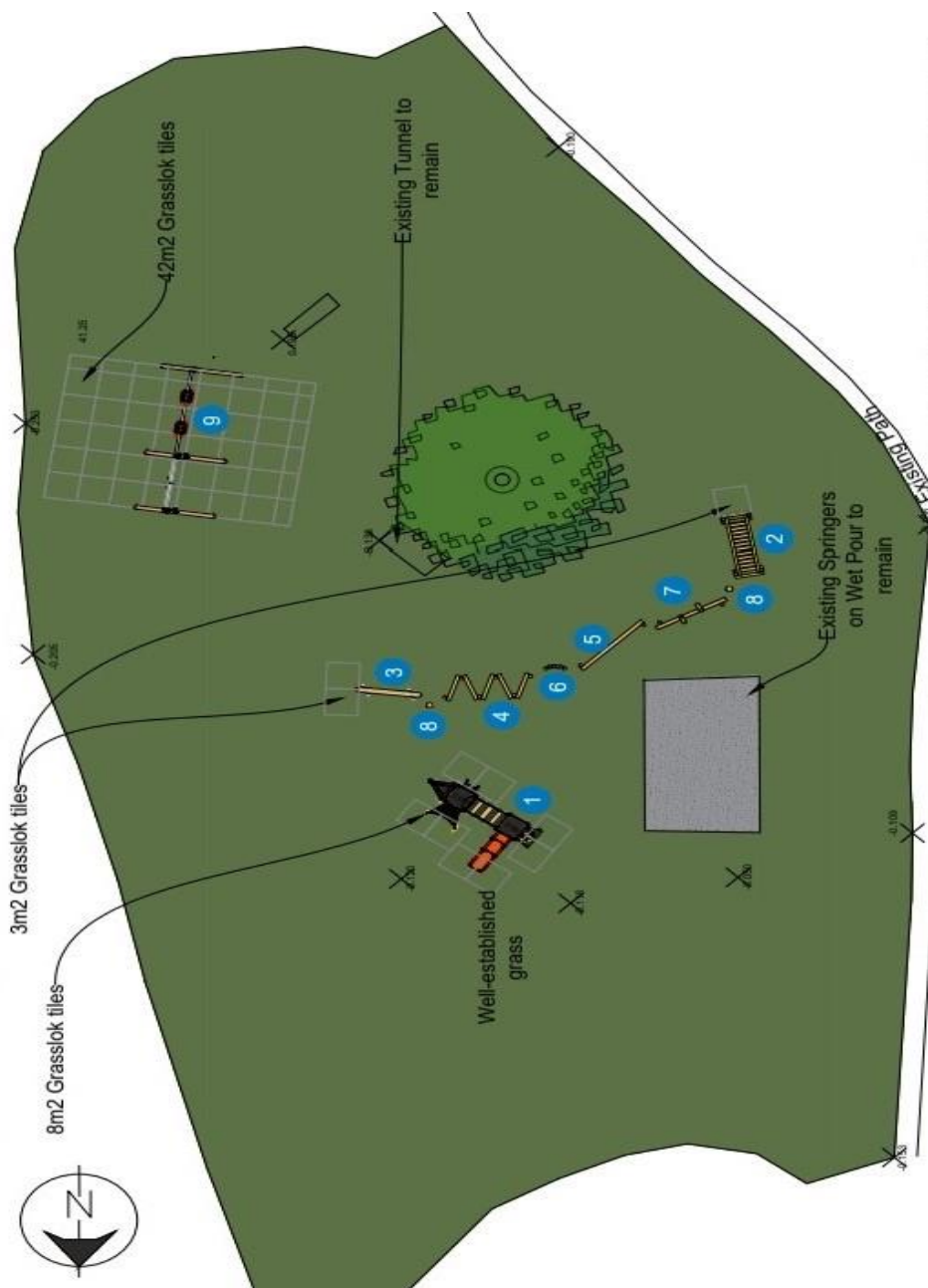
# Weston Village Playing Field

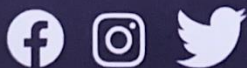

# Allotment news



At the time of writing (January), we are suffering from some very bad weather, what winds we have had! A visit to the allotment had revealed many posts and fences down and items blown onto neighbours' plots. There's some work for members to do when they return.

We are currently being selective with new member applications due to some ex-members leaving their plots in a poor state, having been informed that the plot was not up to standard. New members can start with a quarter or half plot and then progress to a full plot if they show they can fully utilise their plot.

Some members have now bought their seed potatoes and set them in boxes to chit (grow shoots), they will be planted in late March dependent on the weather. This is a good time to plan what you wish to grow, sometimes it's easier to buy plants than grow from seeds. We are fortunate to have some good nurseries in the area, Minshull, Peacock and the Secret Garden to name a few.

# **NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN – UPDATE**

**Since I reported in November last, much work has been taking place behind the scenes in relation to the Neighbourhood Plan.**

Design Guidance for the Plan Area has now been completed, and Cheshire Wildlife Trust have produced their final report on ecology and wildlife.

In December new Planning Guidance was issued by Central Government (National Planning Policy Framework). This concentrates heavily on increasing housing provision. As a result, to ensure that our planning policies are as robust as possible, we felt it important as part of this exercise to produce a Local Housing Needs Appraisal for the whole of the Plan Area. This is currently underway and is being undertaken for us by Cheshire Community Action.

**We're now at the stage where we need your help.**

**Enclosed in this issue of Community News is a simple questionnaire along with a pre-paid return envelope. We'd like you to take a few minutes to complete this and return it to us by Monday 7<sup>th</sup> April.**

# Vacancies on the Parish Council: Being a Councillor

Weston and Crewe Green Parish Council needs four new team members; if you think you would like to join the Parish Council and support the area, and are over 18 years of age contact the Clerk by email at [clerk@westonandcrewegreen-pc.gov.uk](mailto:clerk@westonandcrewegreen-pc.gov.uk)

## What is a Councillor?

Councillors are elected to represent an individual geographical unit on the council, known as a ward, and we have vacancies in each of the three wards – Weston (1), Wychwood (2) and Crewe Green (1).

Councillors are generally elected by the public every four years, but there are four spaces available on the Parish Council at the moment.

## What do Councillors do?

Councillors have three main components to their work.

1. **Decision making** - Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, Councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.
2. **Monitoring** - Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.
3. **Getting involved locally** - As local representatives, Councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the Councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available, and may include:
  - Attending meetings of local organisations
  - Attending meetings of organisations affecting the wider community
  - Taking up issues on behalf of members of the public

## **How much time does it take up?**

Quite often Councillors say that their duties occupy them for about an hour a week. Obviously, there are some Councillors who spend more time than this - and some less, but in the main, being a Parish Councillor is an enjoyable way of contributing to your community and helping to make it a better place to live and work.

As a Councillor representing your community, ideally living within the ward area that you would like to represent, you will help keep it a great place to live and work. You will be supported in your role and training will be provided. You should have a positive outlook and a can-do attitude and be willing to work as part of a team. If, after reading this notice you are interested in applying, please contact the Clerk to the Council using the above details.



# All Saints' Church Improvements

2024 proved to be a slightly frustrating year! Our church is Grade II listed and also sits in the centre of a Conservation area, so our much needed new heating system required Planning Permission as well as legal approval through the Church of England's 'Faculty' system. Submissions for both were initiated in January but it took until August for Cheshire East to agree to the Planning request and it was not until a couple of days before Christmas that the Faculty was agreed. We still need the final legal tick-off by the official 'Registrar', but this is expected imminently.

Removal of the old Victorian pipework will require temporary removal of the pews, which will allow us to repair the plaster where it has long been damaged and repaint all the walls (for the first time in over 40 years!) We also want to repair and insulate the ceiling, but unfortunately it looks as though we'll need further approvals which may preclude this work until a later date. On the more positive side, we now have permission to dispose of the 3 pews that were removed as a trial over 10 years ago – so if anyone would like a piece of Weston heritage, please get in touch as soon as possible.

Following the smart rebuild of the bellcote in 2023, we also now have permission to install a new clock in the vacant stone roundel just below the bell which should enhance the West face.

We are most grateful to the organisers of the Summer & Christmas fairs for donating proceeds to help fund all these works (as well as to all those who have donated personally). We're now in the process of obtaining final quotes, but it looks as though we'll still be facing a shortfall, so further fund-raising will be needed to keep our lovely building in the best condition.

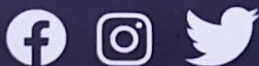

# Weston Village Playing Field

Work begins on new play equipment at Weston Playing Field in Weston



Building work is under way to create a brand-new play equipment circuit for children under 6 years old in Weston.

The Weston Playing Field project is a step closer now that the first items of play equipment are in place at the site in Mere Road, Weston.

The project, which is being funded by a £23,325.92 grant from FCC Communities Foundation, as well as a contribution from Weston and Crewe Green Parish Council, will provide a brand-new play circuit and play equipment once it is officially open this summer.

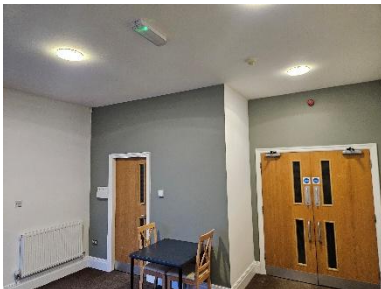

# **WESTON & CREWE GREEN NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN THE NEXT STAGE**



Many thanks to those of you who took the time to complete the questionnaire, which was distributed earlier in the year, along with those who visited the walk-in exhibitions.

The draft Plan has now been completed, along with independent consultant reports dealing with design, ecology and local housing need all of which form an appendix to the Plan.

The draft Plan takes on board your views. The policies are basically aimed at protecting the character of our existing communities and way of life. They will provide a supplementary and complementary detailed back up to the Cheshire East Local Plan to guide new development and help protect us from unplanned and unwanted proposals.

**Before the Plan can be formally submitted to Cheshire East (the Local Planning Authority) for independent examination, the Regulations require a six-week pre consultation period, known as Regulation 14. This will run until 1<sup>st</sup> September.**

We are enormously grateful to everyone who has contributed to our repair fund over the past few years with over £48,000 raised – but we still need a little more to ensure everything is completed.

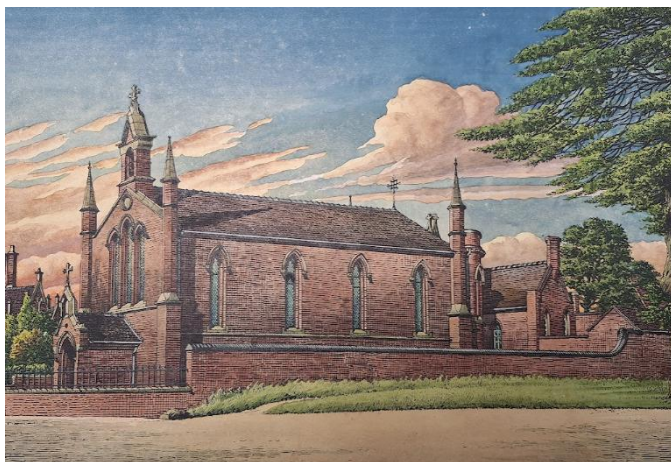

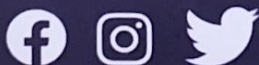
